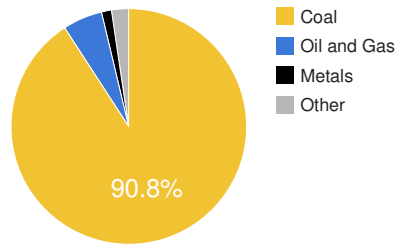


WHAT WE GENERATE IN SOUTH BURNETT

DIRECT SPEND BY COMMODITY IN SOUTH BURNETT

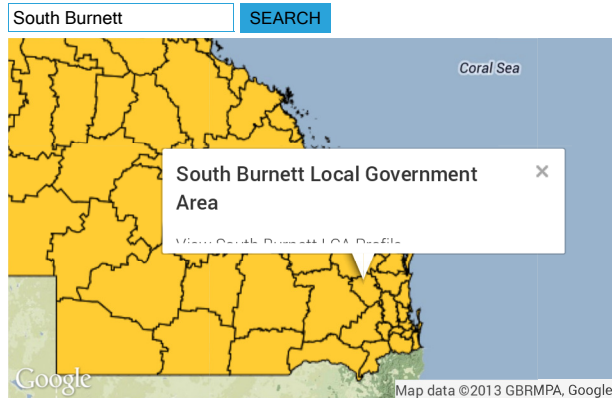


DIRECT CONTRIBUTION¹

In 2012-13, the direct spend by the resources sector in South Burnett was at least \$78 million. This consisted of:

- + \$54 million in wages to 120 direct full-time employees (not including contractors).
- + \$25 million in community contributions and purchases of goods and services from local businesses (including contractors).

INDIRECT CONTRIBUTION²

Spending by the resources sector supported an additional 850 jobs and contributed a further \$64 million to the regional economy because:

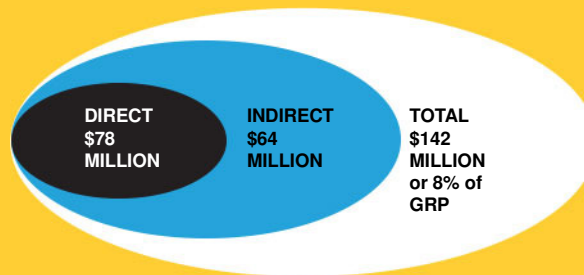
- + Local businesses in the supply chain were sourced
- + Workers spent their wages on locally produced goods and services.

TOTAL CONTRIBUTION

The total economic contribution (direct and indirect) from the resources sector amounted to approximately:

- \$142 million in Gross Regional Product (GRP) or 8% of total GRP in South Burnett
- 970 full-time equivalent jobs or 6% of total employment in South Burnett.

ROYALTIES³

The resource operations in South Burnett produced \$9 million dollars in royalties towards Queensland's total royalty revenue of \$2.58 billion. These royalties represent 11% of the Queensland Governments own-source revenue which is shared among all Queenslanders in the form of health, education, police, environment, roads, community services and other initiatives.

ROYALTIES FOR THE REGION (R4R)

South Burnett received \$0 from a total of \$49 million in round 1 of the R4R Program and is eligible for subsequent rounds of funding.

COMMUNITY CONTRIBUTION

Queensland's resources sector companies make voluntary community contributions across Queensland including equipment for schools and universities, emergency medical services and sporting sponsorships.
